Raising standards, improving lives

- 1.5 million children and their parents benefit from early years services
- 8.1 million children in schools
- 3.6 million people are in colleges
- 385,000 children receive social care services
- 1.3 million learners are in the workplace or the community
- 850,000 people receive training and support to help them find employment


