MINUTES of STEERING GROUP MEETING

Apologies: Simon East, Rob Robson, David Brandon Bravo has indicated that he would be willing to withdraw if a replacement can be found as he is finding it increasingly difficult to attend. Tim Collins is no longer a member.

Welcome to new member Julie Bidwell, Seconded Head of Westley Middle School, Suffolk, currently working with the LA to support School Organisation Review.

- <u>Network Initiative 2008</u>. ML reported that his school is part of a partnership established in Herts, Luton and Bedfordshire; Within School Variation as the focus and WTG reported there are three partnerships in Suffolk – various themes linked to Narrowing the Gap. These groups will report back on 31st March, ML and BK to attend this event at LCC. BK reported on the frustration of the online process that had prevented some groups applying.
- 2. <u>Sustainability</u>: ML reported links with the Cohort 2 ILLP visit taking place in March. Concern expressed that the DCSF seem to be less proactive in raising the profile of sustainable schools/
- **3. SUPRA Events : Review and Planning** All encouraged to recruit to these. ML suggested all members seek to recruit a Governor for the Spring events.
 - a. LCC 6th February 2009 : **Liberating Leadership** Programme now complete, Janet Aldridge and Richard Gerver are providing key note addresses, Tony Woodcock and others the workshops. Details are on the website and attendance currently 100. All accommodation has been taken up.
 - b. LCC 7th May 2009 : **New Models theme, One Head, One School ?** West Mids RLs are coordinating planning, programme currently draft, will be discussed at the Team meeting next week. Programme to be circulated to members once finalised.
- 4. **Regional Events:** ML reported on the November event at Potters Barr. Pete Burkett, Principal at Barnfield was considered to be an exceptionally good session.

Forthcoming events : Matched themes as above.

- a. Spring Term 5th March 2009 at Best Western at Stoke by Nayland. BK coordinating this event, Programme attached 11 registered so far Target up to 25 attendance
- b. Summer Term 18th June 2009 at Hethel Centre, Diss WG coordinating this event, Focus on New models. 21 registered so far.

Speakers: NM to contact Sylvia Campbell to propose Bill Simmonds as a suitable contributor to Summer conference.

5. **Succession Planning Update** – NSC Carol Atkinson reported overview of activity in the region. The following initiatives are contributing to the work:

Internships: No longer funded but several LA's are continuing with this programme as it has proved successful and effective.

Governors: Reported to be a major key to success, much to be done in engaging them and promoting the messages and wider context beyond headteacher induction. WTG presented copy of tool kit and asked members to promote this, it is available on request.

Leadership Partners: Valuable programme being adopted in some LA's, there is an issue of capacity to cope with the wide range of initiatives in some LA's.

Programmes : Members encouraged to be aware of programmes and promote to colleagues.

Associate Heads Programme proving a valuable pilot in some areas

NPQH - Recruitment challenges for small school applicants who seem unable to be successful as they are unable to provide evidence. 51 LA's have been given addition targeted support funding to develop graduates into taking up headship posts.

NPQICL - This is a developing course, WTG reported her approach to members of the Early Leaders Programme being developed by ELC, contacts made and to be followed up for potential new members.

It was agreed that this report was very valuable and that CA would provide an update at each meeting.

6. Steering Group Membership – Roles and Responsibilities Activity Session

A workshop brainstorm took place to assist in developing the work of the steering group.

7. Leadership Network Activity Reports

- a. School Business Management: Nickii Messer was thanked for her hard work and excellent report, this was considered to be good practice and other members invited to provide reports for future meetings.
- b. ECM Champion: Rob Robson was unable to attend so it was agreed to add this to the next agenda
- c. SSAT: Charles Gilbank reported the success of the 11 –19 roadshow events and the positive evaluations received which compared well with other areas, providing a high level of satisfaction from participants. Best of all in the regions. Future challenge is to engage others as there are approx 2/3rd yet to engage.

Dates of future events include: 10th March @ Jack Hunt, 17th March @Swavesey, also June events to be confirmed.

8. **ILLP** – Update: Cohort 3 is recruiting now, members to encourage applications. BK reported that Cohort two visit taking place in June with SSAT will be to either Australia, South Africa or Sweden. WTG will be attending one of these. SE was thanked for her work in supporting the roadshow events in Norfolk and Suffolk. WTG will coordinate the sifting of applications, Helen Banks and Sue Eagle to assist with this process in March.

9. Future Planning and Events

Discussion took place regarding how the group would like to work in the year ahead.

The following requests and proposals were made:

- All events must be explicitly Leadership focussed
- Central Supra events considered effective but that it would be better to have more residential places available if possible.
- Regional events are good but need to be located in schools and costs reduced, locations to be centred effectively for maximum access. Themes to reflect local needs and local solutions perhaps.
- Steering Group Meetings to be strategic and forward looking. Charles offered his school as venue for the next year, all present agreed this would be easily accessible and therefore proposed. WTG to arrange dates with CG for Autumn and Spring before next meeting. Activity session to focus on strategic direction of the group was considered useful and an element of activity should be included in future meetings.
- Breakfast meetings were suggested as a way of engaging more people within a locality. Steering group members are all willing to arrange and coordinate an event in their areas next year. See attached proposal compiled by WTG to be discussed with Sian Carr and Sylvia Campbell. WTG to report back to next meeting.
