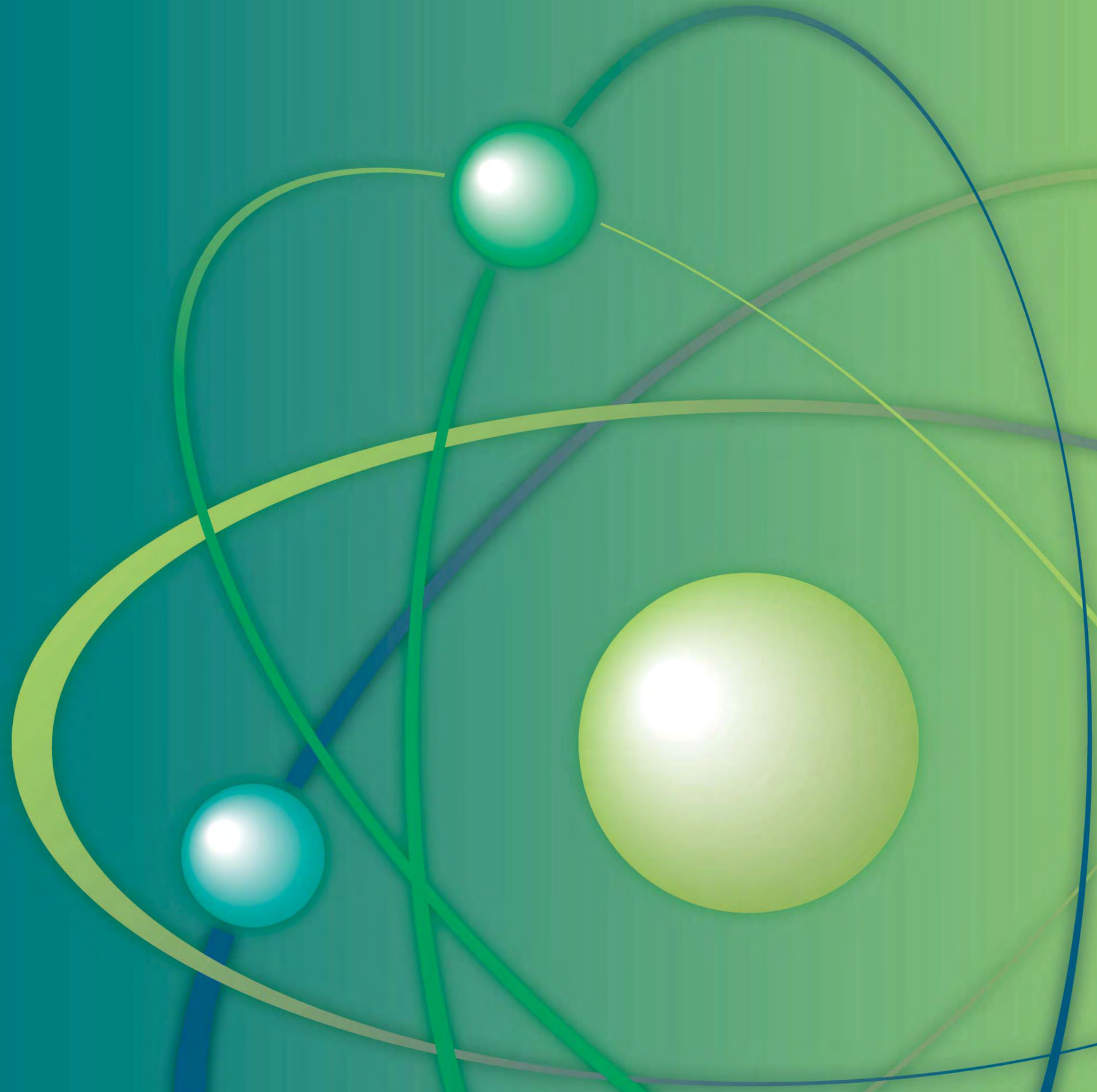

## 2. Four steps to exploring models of leadership

There are four key components that need to be considered as part of a collaborative leadership and governance design:

- **defining the partnership**
- **types of shared provision**
- **form and location of leadership**
- **boundaries and form of governance**

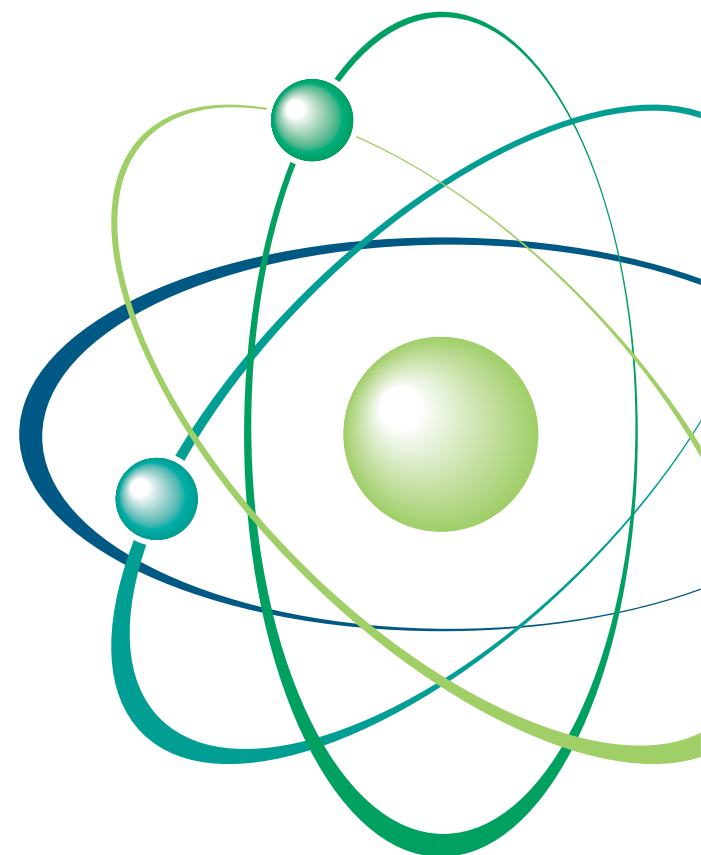
### ... and two further determinants

Schools should be clear and in agreement about why they want to consider new models of leadership together.

They should also have a sense of the potential benefits that a new collaboration or partnership will bring to each partner in terms of better relationships with the external world.

So to the four key components, we can add these two determinants:

- **shared purpose and vision**
- **defining the partnership**
- **types of shared provision**
- **form and location of leadership**
- **boundaries and form of governance**
- **new relationships and alliances beyond the partnership**

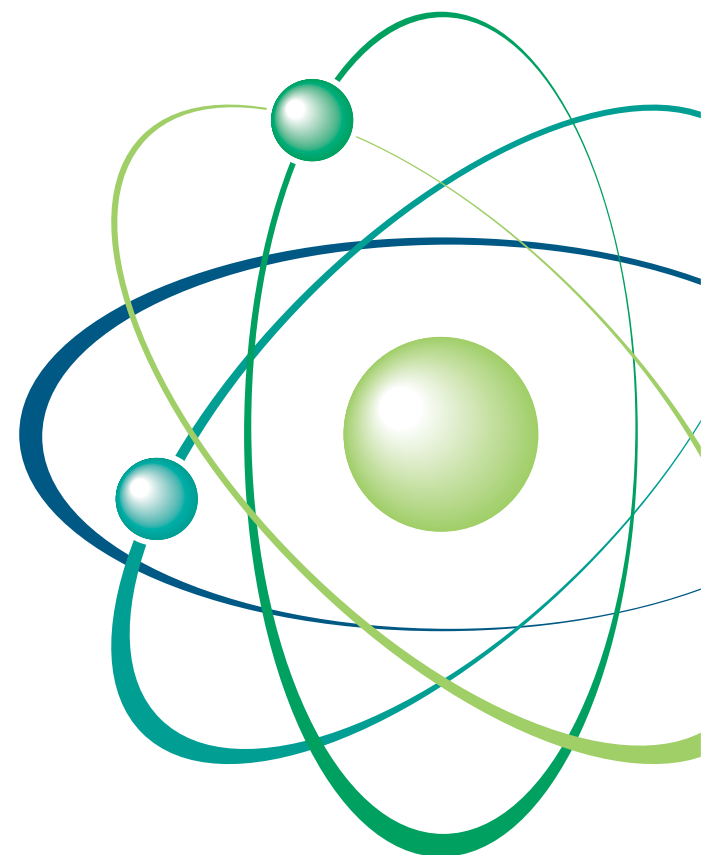


### ... leading to a six-step method

- shared purpose and vision
- defining the partnership
- types of shared provision
- form and location of leadership
- boundaries and form of governance
- new relationships and alliances beyond the partnership

### ... or, in other words

1. **Why are we doing this?**  
Shared purpose and vision – the drivers behind the partnership
2. **Who's in/who's out, and who's close by?**  
Defining the partnership – the schools and other agencies/organisations
3. **What will we do together?**  
The shared provision of curriculum, systems or resources
4. **Who's in charge?**  
The form and location of the leadership – with new roles and responsibilities
5. **Who keeps their eye on it?**  
The boundaries and forms of governance – informal or formal
6. **Who can we work with now?**  
New relationships and alliances beyond the partnership



### In practice ...

In practice, three of the six steps can happen quickly together, or in different orders, depending on the context.

**1. Why are we doing this?**

Shared purpose and vision – the drivers behind the partnership

**2. Who's in/who's out, and who's close by?**

Defining the partnership – the schools and other agencies/organisations

**3a. What will we do together?**

The shared provision of curriculum, systems or resources

**3b. Who's in charge?**

The form and location of the leadership – with new roles and responsibilities

**3c. Who keeps their eye on it?**

The boundaries and forms of governance – informal or formal

**4. Who can we work with now?**

New relationships and alliances beyond the partnership
