What are the big issues for networks? Some tensions and questions arising from the external evaluation of Networked Learning Communities.

This session is intended for conveners and leaders of school networks and those who facilitate and support them. Professor Lorna Earl and Dr Steven Katz of Aporia Consulting Ltd, will introduce interim outcomes from the 'key features investigation' phase of the evaluation of Networked Learning Communities. 7 key features have been identified as potentially significant in the design

and make up of school networks. In this conversation with Lorna and Steven, participants will be invited to work through some of the messages contained in these interim outcomes for their own network, and to contribute to thinking about the implications for the way that networks are designed and led in the wider system.

NLG Mentoring and Coaching Enquiry Group



Sharing the learning - Network Communications - How do you do it?

Through this conversation we hope to problem-solve together the collective challenges faced by networks in supporting the process of sharing and transferring the learning from our networked activity. In particular, we will be interested to explore the communication strategies used by school learning networks in 'connecting up' their work internally and 'connecting out' to a wider audience locally and nationally. There will also be an opportunity to inform the NLC programme in developing and

refining its communications strategy as we move towards an urgent emphasis on sharing the learning from NLCs both nationally and internationally.

This learning conversation will be of particular interest to network leaders, network communications officers or project managers and those involved in establishing newly formed networks who wish to explore the development of effective communications processes and strategies within their network.

Building schools for the future

All secondary schools will be refurbished or remodelled within the next 15 years, according to the Government's recently published Five Year Strategy. Schools — it promises — will provide attractive, flexible learning environments with high-quality facilities to help to meet the needs, interests and aptitudes of every child. From 2005, Building Schools for the Future (BSF) will be providing over £2 billion a year to make this a reality. The conversation will describe aspects of the strategy which will be of interest to primary

colleagues as well, as primary schools are due to become part of the strategy in 2008. The conversation will address three key questions:

- 1) What are the implications for developing pupil learning?
- 2) How will learning be driven forward by the implementation of the BSF strategy?
- 3) What opportunities would this present for your learning network?


Generating learning from innovative group response keypads

conversation will be of particular interest to networks looking to host events with high audience numbers, where feedback may be important. However, audience response systems are equally useful with smaller groups. NCSL has used them in a variety of events, particularly the major conferences, and this learning conversation will offer you insights into why the college sees them as giving added value for group learning.

What are the leadership activities that enable networks to grow and sustain?

We have a developing knowledge of network growth and pivotal factors relating to impact. Around this are central questions relating to common purpose, learning focus, adult learning needs and ensuring measured impact on pupils. Many of these activities are time and context related. By using the Networking for Learning

simulation we can take risks, we can enter at various points in the network journey (at the start, after initial conversations, at the end of year 1 or 2) Today we can ask these questions and then together through conversations develop answers for our own network context that allows risk without any real casualties.




